

# Our Services

## What We Do



### FINANCIAL COUNSELING

Our team of compassionate counselors provided **784 services** to clients helping them create budgets, establish financial goals, build credit, manage debt, learn more about the homebuying process, and secure their housing situations through foreclosure prevention.


Through counseling, clients were able to connect to resources, like a Debt Management Plan (DMP), to build their financial resilience.



### EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS

Our empathetic educators delivered **495 services** to clients through in-person and online workshops in 2025. Our workshops provide a judgement-free community space for clients to learn about positive money habits, create goals, and learn skills to build toward financial resilience.

## SECURE MATCHED SAVINGS

**111 clients** graduated from our Secure Matched Savings program in 2025. Our \$4-to-\$1 incentivized matched savings plan is tied to counseling and workshop requirements that build financial management skills while establishing savings as a habitual process. Clients graduate with up to \$1,010 in emergency savings.

## FREE TAX PREPARATION

Through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site, **957 WNC residents** secured valuable tax refund dollars, saving at least \$300 on tax preparation. That's an accumulated \$260,400 saved! We're grateful to our tax volunteers who make this impact possible—some of whom have been providing free tax preparation services in our community for over a decade.








### Income
